Complete the application and return it to UDAF.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- 1. If deficiencies are found, UDAF will contact you. The COR is normally issued within 10 working days of site inspection and/or application receipt. After issuance of the COR, processing is authorized. UDAF must approve any changes to plans before the COR is issued. This may require filing an new application.
- 2. UDAF inspects your fish processing plant prior to COR approval and at least annually thereafter. The inspection will concentrate on discharge of waterwater, waste product disposal, and fish transfer history.
- 3. Renewal applicants may continue fish processing during application renewal. ANNUAL REPORTS are due to UDAF by December 31 each year. A \$25 late fee is assessed after this date. Report forms are provided by UDAF.
- 4. The UDAF Division of Regulatory Services inspects facilities that process fish for human consumption at least annually. Contact the UDAF Division of Regulatory Services (801-538-7144) to schedule an inspection. The inspection will focus on sanitation of product. Basic state and federal health requirements for a fish processing plant shall be followed, and necessary food handling permits obtained.
- 5. Discharge of wastewater into local public waters near a fish processing plant is illegal when fish, fish parts, or fish waste products are in the discharge water. Law requires fish waste products, i.e., cysts, carcasses, viscera, and waste water, shall be incinerated, buried with quick lime, composted, digested, or disposed of by means acceptable to UDAF to deter the spread of pathogens by water or animals. Placement of dead fish, fish parts, or fish waste products from a fish processing plant into public waters is illegal (R58-17-13-G,H).
- 6. The Aquaculture and Fish Health Rule (R58-17) licenses all aquaculture, fish brokering, fish processing plants, and fee fishing. UDAF officials may inspect your records and facility during reasonable hours.
- 7. It is the responsibility of the applicant to be aware of and abide by local, state, and federal laws and requirements concerning sanitation and health, water use, wetlands, habitat protection, fish & wildlife protection, and aquaculture.
