**Zone:** 4-8

**Color:** Yellow

**Bloom Time:** July through September

**Plant Type:** Perennial herb

**Mature Height:** 1-2' tall

**Mature Spread:** 12" wide

**Water Use:** Low to very low

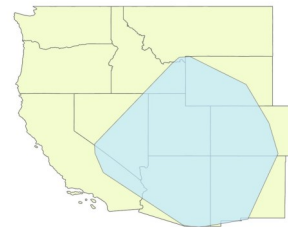
**Soil Type:** Well-drained loam to loamy sand soils.

**Range and Native Habitat:** The Showy Goldeneye occurs throughout the western United States and into Mexico. It inhabits open, dry to moderately moist slopes and roadsides in a variety of habitat types and elevations.

**Suggested Maintenance:** Deadheading and supplemental watering in midsummer will prolong the blooms. After flowering, plants may be cut off at the base unless reseeding is desired.

**Other:** The Showy Goldeneye produces abundant flowers making it especially desirable for revegetation projects in campgrounds, visitor centers, and other recreation areas. It grows in bushy clumps, is long-lived, and spreads readily by seed.

By seed, 10-12 mos after ripening and 4-6 wks cool stratification
