## Northern Area:

Supreme: No data for domestic hay sales

Premium: 500 tons alfalfa hay \$160 to \$180; 800 tons

Good: 500 tons alfalfa hay \$160 to \$180; 800 tons

Fair: alfalfa hay \$105 to \$120 fob stack

## Central Area:

Supreme: 1,125 tons alfalfa hay \$240 to \$250 fob stack, 550 tons longer haul in hard to access areas \$225

Premium: 600 tons \$210 to \$220; 1,850 tons alfalfa hay \$170 to \$180

Good: 475 tons alfalfa hay \$150; 400 tons alfalfa hay some with rain damage \$125 to \$130. data for domestic hay sales

Fair: 450 tons non-rained old crop alfalfa hay \$170 fob barn, staying local. 745 tons rain damaged alfalfa hay \$130 to \$150 fob stack, some was rained on multiple times.

## Southern Area:

Supreme: 500 tons Supreme alfalfa hay \$240 fob barn.

Premium: No data for domestic hay sales

Good: 4,850 tons export alfalfa hay \$220 straight through fob barn.

Fair: No data for domestic hay sales
