Zone: 8-11

Color: Pink

Bloom Time: June to October

Plant Type: Annual herb

Mature Height: 4-5' tall

Mature Spread: 4-6' wide

Water Use: Medium

Soil Type: Prefers clay, but is tolerant to most soils with enough moisture.

Range and Native Habitat: Marsh Fleabane is native to southern Maine to Florida, largely coastal; and west to Texas and beyond. It prefers saline marshes and riparian areas with Fremont's cottonwood, Arizona ash, and seep-willow communities at elevations of 2800 to 3110 feet.

Suggested Maintenance: During the growth period of the plant, water regularly and trim leaves that are yellowing or drying. Once established the plant does not require much maintenance.

Other: Marsh Fleabane has showy, fragrant flowers that attracts butterflies and moths such as the Southern Emerald, Everlasting Bud Moth, and White-lined Sphinx.
