Soil Type: Tolerates clay and sandy soils.

Range and Native Habitat: Fire Chalis is found in Utah, California, Arizona, Nevada, Idaho, and Wyoming. It grows along rocky, sandy washes or canyons in desert, upland, mountain, or riparian areas.

Suggested Maintenance: Cut or mow plant to the base in fall or early winter to encourage new growth. Pull unwanted rhizomes at any time.

Other: Fire Chalis has nectar-filled red flowers that attract a variety of humming birds and butterflies. These plants bloom late and can support native pollinators throughout the season.




Distribution Map
