## Northern Area:

Supreme: No data for domestic hay sales

Premium: 500 tons alfalfa hay \$160 to \$180; 800 tons

Good: 450 tons clean alfalfa hay \$160 to \$165, 450 tons with some stack damage \$150

Fair: 250 tons alfalfa hay with some grass \$130 fob stack. 200 tons big bale wheat straw \$85 fob stack

## Central Area:

Supreme: 500 tons alfalfa hay \$210 fob, 700 tons big bale alfalfa hay \$220 to \$225 fob barn straight through, 1,400 tons wrapped alfalfa hay \$215 fob stack

Premium: 1,700 tons alfalfa hay \$210, current movement, 400 tons 3-way grain hay \$115 fob stack, 700 tons big bale alfalfa hay \$220 to \$225 fob barn straight through

Good: 850 tons alfalfa hay \$140, 300 tons worse damage \$100 to \$120

Fair: 850 tons alfalfa hay \$140, 300 tons worse damage \$100 to \$120

## Southern Area:

Supreme: 750 tons alfalfa hay \$230 fob barn

Premium: 400 tons alfalfa hay \$220 fob barn

Good: 4,850 tons export alfalfa hay \$220 straight through fob barn.

Fair: No data for domestic hay sales
