## Northern Area:

Supreme: No data for domestic hay sales

Premium: 500 tons alfalfa hay \$160 to \$180; 800 tons

Good: 300 tons clean alfalfa hay \$165 fob stack; 100 tons with light rain damage \$130

Fair: 250 tons alfalfa hay with some grass \$130 fob stack. 200 tons big bale wheat straw \$85 fob stack

## Central Area:

Supreme: 1,650 tons alfalfa hay \$245 fob barn, current to winter take-out

Premium: 650 tons low alfalfa hay \$185 fob stack

Good: 150 tons 3-way grain hay \$105 fob stack

Fair: 500 tons alfalfa hay \$150 fob stack, 300 tons rain damaged \$100, 100 tons heavy rain damage \$80

## Southern Area:

Supreme: 400 tons fourth cutting alfalfa hay \$260 fob barn, current to extended movement

Premium: 400 tons alfalfa hay \$220 fob barn

Good: 4,850 tons export alfalfa hay \$220 straight through fob barn.

Fair: No data for domestic hay sales
