News Briefs:

- **Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza:** On October 6, two facilities in Sanpete County were diagnosed with highly pathogenic avian influenza. This disease is highly fatal in poultry and can be spread by wild waterfowl. Backyard producers can find more information on how to protect their birds on the UDAF Avian Influenza website.
- **Animal Health Personnel:** UDAF is looking for two field veterinarians to join our team to protect Utah's animal owners from disease! This position is eligible for loan repayment through PSLF, VMLRP, and the Utah loan repayment program.
- **USDA Veterinary Medicine Loan Repayment Program:** In November, UDAF will be nominating six areas in the state that are underserved by food animal veterinarians for the <u>USDA Veterinary Medicine Loan Repayment Program.</u> To suggest an area for nomination, please contact Dr. Amanda Price at amandaprice@utah.gov.
- West Nile Virus: There have been 17 cases of West Nile Virus reported in Utah horses since August. Most affected horses were not vaccinated for the disease. This disease is spread from birds to people and animals by mosquitoes.
- African Swine Fever: African Swine Fever continues to spread across the globe. UDAF is working with the Utah Pork Producers Association to increase awareness and preparedness for this disease. Swine owners can find more information on how to protect pigs through the USDA Protect our Pigs website.
- **VetCVI:** UDAF is offering <u>VetCVI</u>, a free program, to veterinarians for health certificates, brucellosis vaccination charts, and TB test charts. User guides are available by emailing <u>statevet@utah.gov</u>. <u>Videos</u> are also available from the Kansas Department of Agriculture.
- **2023 Utah One Health Symposium:** The theme of this year's symposium is Urbanization in Utah. The Symposium will be held November 3 at the Davis Conference Center in Layton. CE is available for veterinarians.
- Vesicular Stomatitis: The outbreak of vesicular stomatitis is continuing in California. Texas and Nevada also experienced cases. Vesicular stomatitis causes blisters to form on hairless areas of horses, cattle, and some other species. A webinar for veterinarians on vesicular stomatitis can be viewed here. Suspected cases should be reported immediately to UDAF.
