#### **Basic Supplies**

- □ Large waterproof bin or tote with lid
- □ Ziploc bags
- Permanent marker
- □ Wire cutters
- □ Baling twine

## Phone Numbers

- □ Veterinarian

- Friends/relatives who would be willing to temporarily take your horse
- □ Neighbors

## <u>Records</u>

- □ Lifetime brand card or proof of ownership
- Most recent Coggins test results
- Vaccination and health records
- □ Microchip and paperwork
- □ Insurance policy information
- □ Photos

### **Medications and First Aid**

- List of current medications and doses
- □ Extra supply of medicine
- □ Basic first aid kit (see right)
- □ Hoof pick
- □ Disinfectant

## <u>Tack</u>

- □ Non-nylon rope (nylon can melt in a fire)
- □ Non-nylon halters with ID tag
- □ Muzzle (if needed)
- □ Blindfold
- □ Horse blanket (if cold weather)
- □ Fly mask or spray

## Waste Management

- Pitch fork
- Shavings
- Paper towels
- Hand sanitizer/soap

## Feed and Water

- □ Hay and grain for 3-7 days
- □ Water for 3-7 days (12-20 gallons/day)
- □ Feed and water buckets
- Hay bag or net
- □ Supplements (only if essential)

## **Basic First Aid Kit**

- Digital Thermometer
- □ Small flashlight
- □ Bandage scissors
- □ Hoof pick
- Pocket knife
- White adhesive tape
- Duct tape
- □ Latex/Nitrile gloves
- □ 4" x 4" gauze squares and non-stick pads
- Cotton roll
- □ No-cling gauze wrap or brown gauze roll
- Vet wrap
- □ Triple antibiotic ointment
- Eye saline solution
- Ophthalmic triple antibiotic ointment
- □ Disinfectant (betadine or chlorhexidine)
- Banamine paste
- Phenylbutazone tablets
- □ Fly repellent
- □ Large syringe for flushing wounds
