**Zone:** 7-9

**Color:** Yellow

**Bloom Time:** March through June

**Plant Type:** Shrub

**Mature Height:** 3-5' tall

**Mature Spread:** 3' wide

**Water Use:** Low

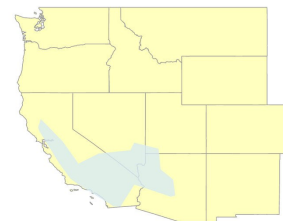
**Soil Type:** Sand, rocky soils

**Range and Native Habitat:** Interior goldenbush has a narrow range in Arizona, Nevada, California, and the extreme southwest corner of Utah. It can be found in creosote bush scrub, chaparral, pinyon-juniper woodlands, and Joshua tree woodlands. It inhabits mountainsides, dry creek beds, deserts, mesas, and interior plains between 3,000 and 6,500 feet in elevation.

**Suggested Maintenance:** Little maintenance is required for the interior goldenbush.

**Other:** Interior goldenbush is also known as narrowleaf and linearleaf goldenbush. Little has been documented about this species.
