



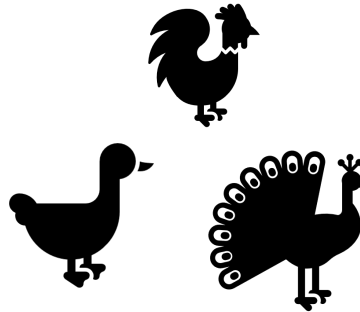
Control Area and Permitting for Bird and Poultry Product Movement

Your property is located within a Control Area for highly pathogenic avian influenza because a commercial facility within 10 km of your property has tested positive for the disease.

To prevent the spread of the disease to your birds and others, no live birds, eggs, or other poultry products can be moved on or off of your property without a permit from the Utah State Veterinarian's office. Testing or a visit by a member of the response team may also be required.

To request a permit for movement, please email statevet@utah.gov and provide the following information:

- Name
- Address
- Species (i.e. chicken, turkey, duck, etc.)
- Live animal or eggs and number
- Movement date
- Destination name and address.



Movement restrictions will be lifted once the Department is satisfied that there is no more risk of disease spread in the Control Area. Typically, this includes:

- Depopulation and disposal of all infected birds
- Cleaning and disinfection of all infected barns and equipment
- Surveillance tests of birds on other properties indicate there is no infection in the control area

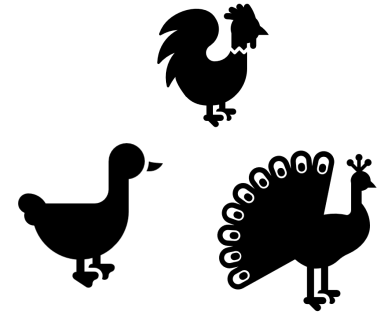
