Subject: New Utah Pollinator Habitat Program Manager Announcement

As many of our past and present program awardees are aware, the Pollinator Habitat PILOT Program was founded in 2021 with the creation of HB 224 Pollinator Amendments. This past spring, in the 2025 legislative session, the State voted for HB 251 to provide ongoing funding to the Pollinator Habitat Program creating a permanent initiative under the Utah Department of Agriculture and Food's Conservation Division. With this exciting development also came the creation of a permanent Program Manager position to oversee the continuation of existing services and the expansion of the program's reach and scope.

We are thrilled to welcome our new Utah Pollinator Habitat Program Manager, Elizabeth Hamilton! We are excited to have her join our team and contribute to the vital work of protecting and promoting pollinator habitats across Utah. Liz comes to us with a background in horticulture, habitat restoration, and grant program management.

Her expertise and leadership will be invaluable as she continues to expand our efforts in conservation, education, and community engagement. We are confident that she will play a crucial role in advancing the mission and making a significant impact on the health of our ecosystems.

The current Utah Habitat Program team that you have all come to know and make lasting friendships with over the years will be slowly transitioning the Program fully over to the Utah Department of Agriculture by the end of September 2025. This incredible group of individuals has been instrumental in the program creation, the success of which is seen in their passion for native pollinators and plants that has resulted in the distribution of over 131,000 native plants and nearly 19 million native plant seeds in the ground over the last three years. Securing ongoing funding for the Pilot would not have been possible without their hard work and dedication. Liz will be working closely alongside this group to ensure a smooth transition with the stakeholders and UPHP community.
