



UTAH POLLINATOR HABITAT PROGRAM

Littleleaf Pussytoes (*Antennaria microphylla*)



Zone: 2-7

Color: White with pink blush

Bloom Time: May to July

Plant Type: Herbaceous Perennial

Mature Height: 4-12 inches

Mature Spread: 1-2 feet

Water Use: Low

Soil Type: Thrives in a variety of well-drained soils but generally prefers loamy or clay-rich soils, and can also tolerate sandy and rocky soil.

Range and Native Habitat: Tolerating a wide range of locations from flood habitat to alpine meadow and sagebrush steppe, it can be found from very northern Canada to New Mexico and as far east as Minnesota.

Suggested Maintenance: Divide every three to four years to propagate, deadheading blooms can create a tidy groundcover aesthetic. Plants can be short-lived unless regularly divided. Allow soils to dry out completely in between waterings.

Other: Host plant for American Lady butterfly larval stage.
