Subject: Pharmacy Labels

In accordance with the requirements of Utah code pertaining to the labeling of medical cannabis and interactions between Medical Cannabis Patients and law enforcement, and specifically based on Utah Code Annotated sections [4-41a-1101](#) (9), [4-41a-602](#)(1), and Rule [R66-2-13](#), Medical Cannabis Pharmacies in Utah are mandated to securely affix the following information to the medical cannabis container:

1. The name, address, and telephone number of the medical cannabis pharmacy.
2. The date of sale.
3. The name of the patient.
4. The name of the recommending medical provider.
5. For unprocessed flower: the legal use termination date, as defined in [26B-4-201](#), Definitions. Subsection (22) of this section defines "Legal use termination date" as a date on the label of an unprocessed cannabis flower container that: (a) is 60 days following the date of purchase of the cannabis; and (b) after which, the cannabis ceases to be considered in a medicinal dosage form outside the primary residence of the relevant medical cannabis patient cardholder.
6. Directions for use may be required on the pharmacy label if the processor's label does not contain such directions.

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- The subsequent information is generally not required on the pharmacy label as it is mandated on the processor's label under either [4-41a-602](#) or [R66-2-13](#):
 - Unique identifier.
 - Amount dispersed and cannabinoid profile.
 - Suggested use or expiration date.
 - It is reiterated that, for unprocessed flower, the legal use termination date must be present on the pharmacy label.
 - Pharmacies are required to add directions for use if the processor has failed to include them on the processor label.
 - "Label securely affixed to the container" denotes that the label is attached to the immediate drug container (e.g., bottle, vial, tube) in a permanent manner, thereby ensuring its retention and legibility throughout the entire expected shelf life, including during distribution, storage, and patient utilization.
 - The label must resist peeling, smudging, or detachment during handling. The required information must remain associated with the product until the final dose has been consumed.
